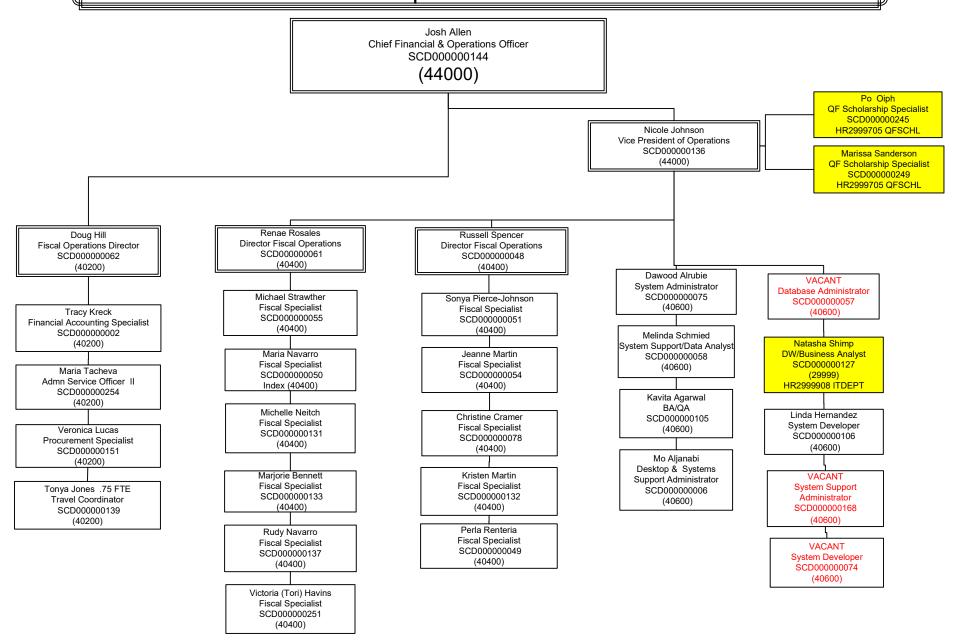

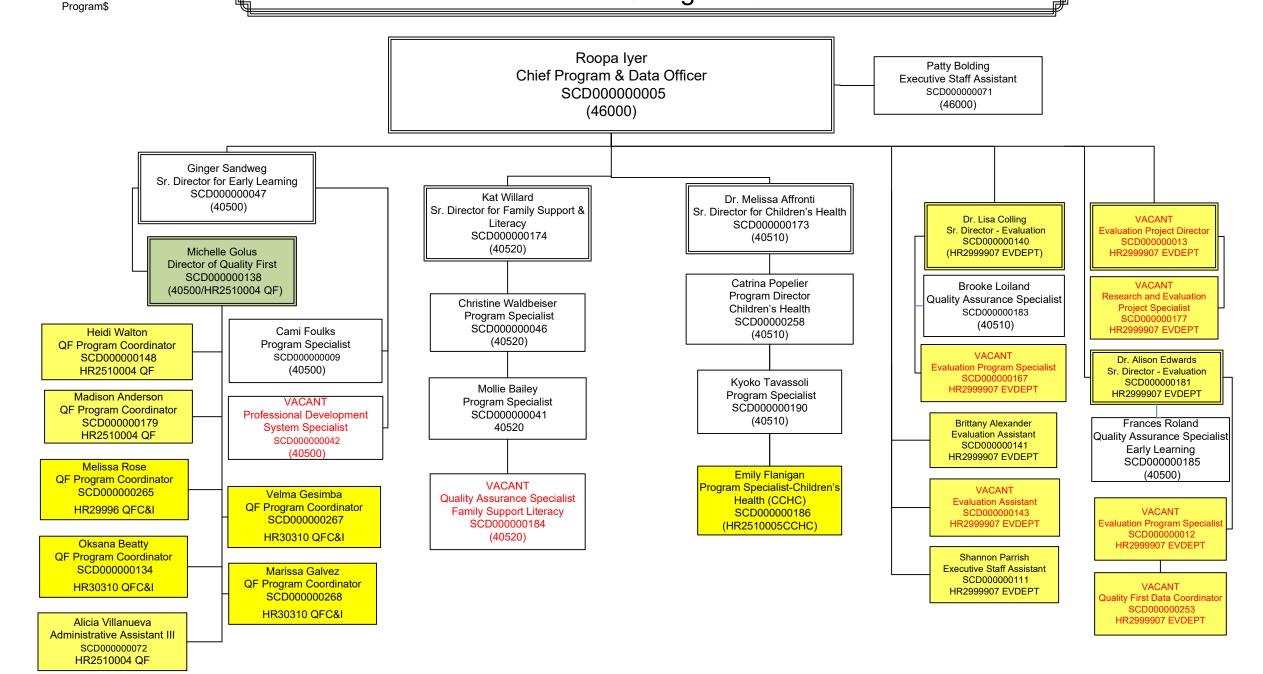


Arizona Early Childhood Development & Health Board Operations Unit



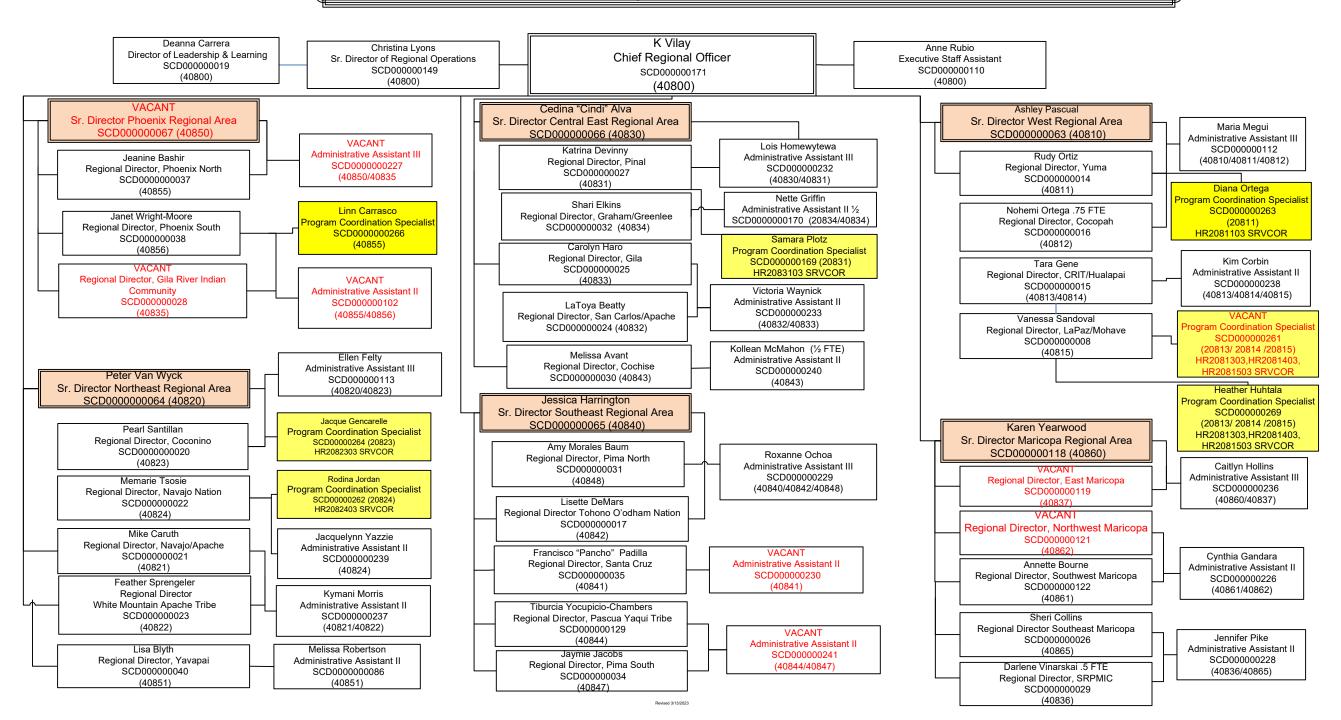

Forecast Methodology

Pursuant to ARS 8-1181, the fund is established and the Board administers the fund (AFUND 2542).

Statute states that 90% of the funds collected are deposited to the "Program" account (Fund 2542) and the remaining 10% to the "Administrative Costs" account (Fund 2543). The monies in these accounts are not subject to legislative appropriation and are non-lapsing.

The source of the revenue is additional tax levied on tobacco products and is detailed in ARS 42-3371. In addition to all other taxes, there is levied and shall be collected by the department in the manner provided by this chapter, on all cigarettes, cigars, smoking tobacco, plug tobacco, snuff, and other forms of tobacco tax:

- 1. On each cigarette, 4 cents,
- 2. On smoking tobacco, snuff, fine cut chewing tobacco, cut and granulated tobacco, shorts and refuse of fine cut chewing tobacco, and refuse, scrubs, clippings, cuttings, and sweepings of tobacco, excluding tobacco powder or tobacco products used exclusively for agricultural or horticultural purposes and unfit for consumption, 9 cents per ounce or major fraction of an ounce
- 3. On all Cavendish, plug, or twist tobacco, 2.2 cents per ounce or fractional part of an ounce.
- 4. On each twenty small cigars or fractional part weighing not more than three pounds per thousand, 17.8 cents.
- 5. On cigars of all descriptions except those included in paragraph 4, made of tobacco or any tobacco substitute:
- a. If manufactured to retail at not more than 5 cents each, 8.8 cents on each three cigars
- b. If manufactured to retail at more than 5 cents each, 8.8 cents on each cigar.

Pursuant to Prop 203 Section 4-A.1, all funds deposited on or before June 30, 2007, into the Early childhood Development and Health fund pursuant to ARS 42-3772 were deposited to the "Administrative Costs" account (Fund 2543).

The "Program" account (Fund 2542) receives 90% of revenues generated from the additional tax levied on tobacco products pursuant to ARS 42-3371 to be used for Statewide programs (10% of the fund) and Regional programs (90% of the fund) focusing on early childhood health and education.

The tobacco tax revenue forecasting and projections are based on actual outcomes, and historical and current demographic data: along with factors such as demand, effects of anti-smoking programs and campaigns, public/community smoking restrictions, and alternative choices, such as e-cigarettes. Over the last five years, Arizona's tobacco tax revenue has been declining, as has been the trend with tobacco revenues on the national level. The Early Childhood Development and Health Board (FTF) estimates a rate of approximately \$1 to \$2 million a year, and predicts this decline to continue. As a result, to assist with the budgeting (forecasting/projections) of the tax revenues, in 2012 the agency commissioned the William Seidman Institute, W.P. Carey School of Business, at Arizona State University. Subsequent studies were prepared by the William Seidman Institute in 2014, 2016, 2018, 2020 and with the most recent being completed in the June of 2022. FY23 realized collections were at the very low end of the range predicted in the June 2022 study, and this new low point is the starting point for future projections.
